BERNARDS HIGH SCHOOL



BERNARDSVILLE, NJ

If you went to Bernards High School ("BHS") your 7th and/or 8th grade year, did you ever wonder why there were so many new classmates to meet and greet the first day of your 9th grade year? Well, there's an answer to this question. Most of these new people came from the Bedminster Township School (K-8) and the School of St. Elizabeth (K-8). Today, BHS is part of a regional public school serving students K-12 - Somerset Hills Regional School District ("SHRSD"). SHRSD is comprised of the Bedwell Elementary School (K-4), Bernardsville Middle School (5-8), and BHS (9-12). Participating municipalities include: Bernardsville (K-12), Far Hills (K-12), Peapack-Gladstone (K-12) and Bedminster (9-12). When we were in school, however, participating municipalities included: Bernardsville (K-12), Far Hills (9-12), Peapack-Gladstone (9-12) and Bedminster (9-12). NOTE: Today, the 7th and 8th grade classes are no longer at BHS. Not long after we graduated, these grades were moved to the newly built Middle School.

PUBLIC ELEMENTARY SCHOOLS



BEDMINSTER, NJ

In the early 1900's, the Bedminster Township School ("BTS") started as a one-room schoolhouse on the corner of Main Street and Elm Street in Bedminster for K-8 grades. After graduating from BTS, these students all went to BHS for 9-12 grades. In 1946, buses made it possible for BTS to transport students and divide grades 1-8 among three different one-room schools - Pluckemin (1-2), Pottersville (3 -4) and Bedminster (5-8). In 1959, due to overcrowding, BTS expanded its facility and resumed responsibility for K-8. The Pluckemin and Pottersville schoolhouses were closed.



PEAPACK-GLADSTONE, NJ

Today, the Borough of Peapack-Gladstone sends all of its students to SHRSD. Prior to 1980, however, the borough maintained an elementary school (K-8). In 1980, the borough closed its elementary school and, after establishing a send-receive relationship with SHRSD, sent all of its students to the Bedwell Elementary School (K-4), Bernardsville Middle School (5-8), and BHS (9-12).



FAR HILLS, NJ

The Borough of Far Hills was incorporated in 1921. Prior to its incorporation, its residents were part of Bernards Township whose children attended one of three local schoolhouses - Mine Brook, Mount Prospect or Union. In 1899, the village of Far Hills was founded and land was put aside for community use including a village school (K-8) - Schley School (aka Schley Hall). Graduates of Schley Hall went to BHS for 9-12 grades. In 1967, the borough completed its phase-out of Schley Hall due to declining school enrollment and rising educational costs and created a send-receive relationship with BTS (K-8). In 1984, as was done by the Borough of Peapack-Gladstone in 1980, the Borough of Far Hills terminated its K-8 send-receive relationship with BTS and created a new send-receive relationship with SHRSD.

Enjoy apple picking at Melick's Town Farm Cider Mill & Orchard in Oldwick, followed by a mid-day Box Lunch at Natirar County Park in Peapack - Gladstone and a hard cider tasting session in the afternoon at Burnt Mills Cider Farm in Bedminster.

The Farm is owned and operated by the Melick Family. Its' been in the same family for 10 generations and is one of the largest commercial orchards and cider production centers in Jersey. With over 200 acres of prime farmland to walk about and thousands of fruit trees to choose from, you can pick your own apples, and drink Melick's own brand of apple cider for that "true cider taste."

The Park is owned by Somerset County. Purchased in 2003, it was once the home of Kate Macy Ladd, heiress to a whaling, shipping and oil fortune, who built the beautiful brick Tudor mansion

on top of the hill (formerly known as Maple Cottage) overlooking the North Branch of the Raritan River on this 500-acre estate. She named the estate Natirar, Raritan spelled backwards. During her lifetime, Kate Macy Ladd devoted much of her time and energy to the problems of women needy of convalescence to regain their strength after a recent illness. After her death in 1945, Maple Cottage was converted into a convalescent home to provide free medical care to ambulatory female patients following a recent medical or surgical condition. Over 20,000 convalescent women have benefited from the Ladds' generosity. In accordance with Kate Macy Ladd's husband's will, Natirar ran continuously until 1983 (50 years after his death) when it was sold to King Hassan II of Morocco. He used the property as a permanent residence for his children attending Princeton University at the time – Mohammed VI and Prince Moulay Rachid. King Mohammed VI, who became king of Morocco following his father's death in 1999, sold Natirar to Somerset County in 2003.



The Cidery is one of only four cideries in New Jersey. It opened for business at the start of the COVID pandemic in June of 2020. Due to the youth of the apple trees on the property, they've yet to make cider from their own apples. Their apple juice is sourced from New York State. Their name was taken from an unincorporated area in neighboring Branchburg Township – namely, Burnt Mills (formerly Bromley) – situated at the confluence of the Lamington River and the North Branch of the Raritan River. During the American Revolution, Bromley was the site of a mill and general store owned by Andrew Leake who supplied flour and grain to George Washington and his army. The Jacobus

Vanderveer House & Museum where General Know was headquartered was but a “stone's throw” away from this mill. In 1777, after learning a British foraging party was approaching the town, Leake threw everything inside his mill into the river. In reprisal for his actions and defiance to the crown, the British burned down his mill (twice) and renamed the town Burnt Mills.

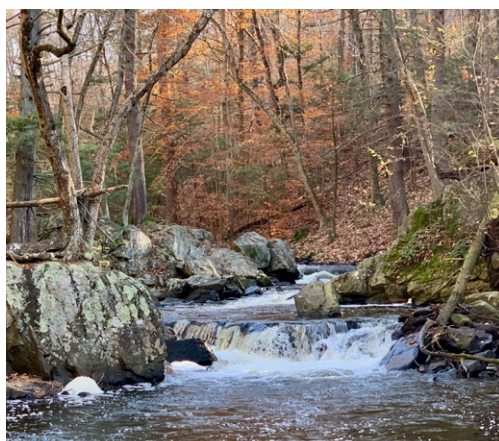

Enjoy a morning hike at Hacklebarney State Park in Long Valley, followed by a mid-day box lunch at Morristown National Historical Park – Jockey Hollow in Bernardsville and a beer tasting session in the afternoon at Oakflower Brewing Company in Millington.

The Park was created in 1924 with a single land gift of 34 acres from two of its local residents, Adolphe & Sarah Borie. In time, they would give more. Today, this 1,000-acre park is said to be the most beautiful park in all of New Jersey. Thru its heart runs the Black River ((also known as the Lamington River downstream from Pottersville), the wildest and most scenic river in all of New Jersey. The hiking trails inside the park were built at the height of “The

Golden Age of Parks” by the US Civilian Conservation Corps (“CCC”) between 1933 and 1943. They run along the Black River and its tributaries – Rhinehart Brook and Trout Brook.

The Hollow was created in 1933 and was the site of George Washington’s encampment of 2,000 Pennsylvania soldiers during the hard winter of 1779-1780. Henry Wick, then the largest landowner in Morristown, owned the 1,400-acre farm on which the encampment was built. His original house and kitchen garden, along with soldier huts, have all been restored and/or reconstructed and are on full display for everyone to see.

The Brewery just opened for business Thanksgiving Weekend in 2022. Situated on Main Street in quiet downtown Millington, it is the closest brewery to Bernardsville and has received a lot of good reviews on Yelp.

Tour the Jacobus Vanderveer (Knox) House & Museum in Bedminster, followed by a mid-day box lunch at Willowwood Arboretum in Bedminster and a wine tasting session in the afternoon at Tomasello Winery at Alstede Farm in Chester.

The House was listed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1995. It was the home of Jacobus Vanderveer and served as General Henry Knox Headquarters during the American Revolution the winter of 1778-79. It is the only surviving building associated with the Pluckemin Continental Artillery Cantonment, America’s first military academy and forerunner to the US Military Academy at West Point.

The Arboretum, originally named Paradise Farm, was founded as a private arboretum by Henry & Robert Tubbs in 1908. Over the next half century, they collected and grew over 3,500 types of native and exotic plants, many of them rare. Today, The Arboretum is part of the Morris County Park System. Some of the largest trees and rarest plants in New Jersey can be seen here.

The Winery evolved from what was once a fruit farm founded in Hammonton, NJ by Frank Tomasello in the early 1930’s. In 1933, at the end of Prohibition, he was one of the first to receive a license (#68) from the US government to make wine. That same year, after New Jersey repealed prohibition, he was one of the first to actually make wine. Today, The Winery is the only third generation family-owned winery in New Jersey. Most of its wines are made from grapes and local fruit grown on their estate. They grow over 30 different varieties of grapes and produce nearly 50 different types of wine.

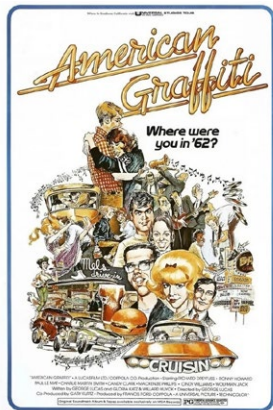

Tour the class rooms and walk the halls of our alma mater, followed by a mid-day box lunch in the BHS Cafeteria and a private showing of *American Graffiti* in the afternoon at the Bernardsville Cinema.

The School was originally housed entirely out of the Tudor Revival building on Olcott Avenue beginning in 1908. Frederick Olcott, financier and philanthropist donated the land and building after buying the property from his surrounding neighbors. Henry Hardenbergh, a famous well known NYC architect, designed the building. In 1927, the town build a new school. This is the one we remember. The design is "Art Deco". In the mid '60's, just before we attended this school, a junior high school (7th & 8th grade) and cafeteria were added on to the high school.

After graduating in '73, the junior high school was moved to another building was built on Seney Drive. NOTES: Inscribed over the front entry to the Olcott School is the phrase - "Knowledge is Power". Over time, this building was repurposed. Today, it is home to the administrative offices of the Somerset Hills School District including Bedwell Elementary, Bernardsville Middle School and Bernards High School. Other works by Hardenbergh include - Dakota Apartment Building, Waldorf Hotel, Astoria Hotel, and Plaza Hotel.



The Cinema was built in 1910 by Frank Allen (a developer of other important buildings in downtown Bernardsville). In 1913, he opened its doors to a 500-seat vaudeville theater - 100 in the balcony, 400 on the main floor. In 1918, it reopened as a 400 seat silent films motion picture theater - 400 on the main floor, a projection room in the balcony. In 1929, silent films ended when "talkies" became all the rage. Little changed until the early 90's when the interior of the grand old theater was converted into a triplex theater. Over the past 113 years, many companies have owned and operated the theater business inside this building: Columbia Theater, Liberty Theater, Clearview Cinema Corp., and BowTie Cinemas. Bernardsville Cinema took over in 2019. Regarding ownership of the building, little has changed. Upon Frank Allen's death, the property was inherited by his daughter. Upon her death in 1983, the property was sold to Olcott Square Corporation.

American Graffiti, directed by George Lucas and produced by Francis Ford Coppola, is a coming-of-age comedy drama about a group of high school friends on their last night of summer vacation in 1962. In 1995, the US Library of Congress deemed the film "culturally, historically, or aesthetically significant" and selected it for preservation in the National Film Registry.

ABOUT THE PEOPLE & ORGANIZATIONS BEHIND NAMED SCHOLARSHIPS & SPONSORED AWARDS

Scholarships

FREDERIC PEPOON OLCOTT MAJOR & MINOR SCHOLARSHIPS: These scholarships began in 1910 in honor of Frederic Pepoon Olcott. Mr. Olcott established these scholarships through a trust fund established prior to his passing. He was born in Albany, NY on February 23rd 1841. He died on April 15th 1909 in Bernardsville, NJ. He was educated at the Albany Academy in NY. A former comptroller of New York State, he organized, reorganized, served as director, president, or president and director of various railroad and other large industrial companies, most prominent among them being the Central Trust Company of New York; the Bank of America; the Morristown Trust Company; the Philadelphia & Reading Railroad; the Galveston, Houston & Henderson Railroad; the Denver City Cable Road; the Brooklyn Elevated Railroad; the Third Avenue Railroad; the Brooklyn Wharf and Warehouse Company; the Pennsylvania Coal Company; the Toledo, St. Louis & Kansas City Railroad; the Cincinnati Northern Railroad; the Detroit, Toledo & Milwaukee Railroad; the Delaware, Lackawanna & Western Railroad; the Distilling Company of America; the United States Realty Company; the New York, Chicago, and St. Louis Railroad; and the Sixth Avenue Street Railroad. His local philanthropic works included the purchase and donation of Stewart Wolfe's 27-acre campus and the original nine-room building for Bernards High School, which was named after him, as was the former Wolfe Avenue in the center of town. He also purchased the property for the Catholic Church of Our Lady of Perpetual Help in Bernardsville and contributed to its building fund and founded the Bernardsville Public Library. His estate was turned into Somerset Hills Country Club posthumously. He was married to Mary Esmay Olcott and had a son, Dudley II, and a daughter, Edith.

CLASS OF '73 RECIPIENTS: Mary White (Major) and Merrill Farhat (Minor)

LEONARD VEITH MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP: This award began in 1973. The Kiwanis Club of Bernardsville sponsored this award in honor of one of its members who recently passed away - Leonard Veith. He was born in New York City on January 3rd 1902. He died on August 24th 1970 in Morristown, New Jersey. Educated in New York City and a graduate of Cooper Union University, he was an electrical engineer for Bell Telephone Laboratories. He was a member and former president of the Bernardsville Board of Health and the Board of Adjustment. He also was a past president of the Kiwanis Club of Bernardsville, a member of the Telephone Pioneers of America and the Acoustical Society of America. He was president of the Somerset Hills Little League, and his home was adjacent to the Somerset Hills Country Club. He was chairman of the buildings and grounds committee in the creation of Claremont Field in Bernardsville. He was married to Grace Nelson Veith and had daughters Marcia and Barbara Kay.

ANTHONY FERRANTE SCHOLARSHIP: This scholarship began in 1973. His wife, Mary Ferrante, sponsored this scholarship. He was born in Bernardsville, New Jersey on October 21st 1906. He died on October 17th 1969 in Morristown, New Jersey. He purchased the Hoffman Quarry and founded, owned and operated various Bernardsville-based companies affiliated with the work in the quarry, including Anthony Ferrante & Sons; the Ferrante Equipment Company; Somerset Crushed Stone; and Mine Hill Sand & Gravel. He also was president of the North American Finance Corporation and was a communicant of the Church of Our Lady of Perpetual Help, both of Bernardsville, and the Bernardsville chapter of the Kiwanis Club. He donated to local projects such as fill for a playground on Claremont Avenue, which he also supervised and worked on with Kiwanians like Edward Buchanan and was known in the community for opening his family's Bernardsville estate, "Tall Oaks," for fundraisers given by such organizations as local firemen, Kiwanis Club, local churches, the Heart Fund and the National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis. He was married to Maria Licciardello Ferrante and had sons James and Constantine, and daughters Anne, Elizabeth, and Laura.

He served in the U.S. Marine Corps in the Pacific Theater during WWII, where he was highly decorated. After the war, he was a member of the U.S. Marine Corps Reserves where he was promoted to Major General and served a term as national president of the Marine Corps Reserve Officers Association. He was a member of the Green Committee of the Somerset Hills Country Club in Bernardsville and the United States Golf Association in Far Hills and was a founding member of Roxiticus Golf Club with Bernard Shanley. He also was a vestryman at St. Luke's Episcopal Church in Gladstone. He was married to Honora Mason, who passed away young. He then was married to Anne Hostetter Winston. She was born in New York City, New York in 1915. She died in 2002 in Gladstone, New Jersey. She was raised at Cedar Lane Farm in Lamington and attended the Fermata School in Aiken, South Carolina and Miss Hewitt's School in New York City, New York. She was a founding breeder of Norfolk terriers and a president of the Norwich Terrier Club of America. She was a member of the Peapack-Gladstone Borough Council, on the vestry of St. Luke's Episcopal Church in Gladstone, president of the Somerset Hills Kennel Club, and a member of the Somerset Hills Garden Club and the Somerset Hills Country Club. John and Anne Winston raised three daughters: Mary, from Major General Winston's first marriage, and Jennifer and Deborah.

BERNARD MICHAEL SHANLEY III ESSAY AWARD: This award began in 1954. Bernard Michael Shanley sponsored the award. Bernard Michael Shanley III was born in Newark, New Jersey in 1903. He died on in 1992 in Bernardsville, New Jersey. He graduated from St. Benedict's Preparatory School in Newark, attended Notre Dame University and transferred to Columbia University where he graduated and was the college roommate, fraternity brother, and baseball teammate of Lou Gehrig. After receiving his law degree from Fordham University, he founded the law firm of Shanley & Fisher of Newark, later of Morristown. He served in the U.S. Army in Italy and North Africa during World War II. Active in in state and national Republican politics, he served under President Dwight D. Eisenhower as Special Counsel, Deputy White House Chief of Staff, and Appointments Secretary. He was a director of the Public Service Electric and Gas Company and the Chubb Corporation and was counsel to the New Jersey Chamber of Commerce. He was a member of Somerset Hills Golf Club and a former founding member and owner of Roxiticus Golf Club in Mendham. He served as an advisory board member of St. Benedict's Preparatory School, was a trustee of the Victoria Foundation, and was on the board of directors of the Tri-County Scholarship Fund. He was a member of the Church of Our Lady of Perpetual Help of Bernardsville. He was married to Maureen Virginia Smith Shanley and had sons Brendan, Kevin and Seton and daughters Maureen and Brigid.

CAROLINE BAYARD STEVENS WITTPENN ENGLISH AWARD: This award began in 1959. Caroline Bayard Stevens Wittpenn was born in Hoboken, New Jersey in 1859. Her nephew, Robert Livingston Stevens, Jr., is the likely sponsor of this award. She died in 1932 in Hoboken, New Jersey. She was educated at the Bonchurch School on the Isle of Wight in England. Descended from the prominent Stevens family of New Jersey, she was an influential social reformer best known for her work in the New Jersey criminal justice system. Stevens Institute of Technology was founded from an 1868 bequest from her grandfather, Edwin Augustus Stevens. Her Grandfather's father-in-law, Stephen S. Whitney, help found St. Bernard's School in 1900. She pushed for reforms of the state Charities Aid Association and sought improvements in living conditions for children in almshouses. Her criminal justice campaigns included advocacy for a juvenile court system and a separate women's prison, which led to the creation of Clinton Farms Reformatory, where she was president of its board of managers. She was a board member of the New Jersey Department of Institutions and Agencies, was president of the state Board of Children's Guardians, and the New Jersey Conference of Social Welfare. She was an adviser to Governor Woodrow Wilson on welfare

issues and was appointed to the International Prison Commission by President Herbert Hoover. She became the first woman from New Jersey on the Democratic National Committee. A summer resident of Bernardsville for over a decade, one of her bequests was to St. Bernard's Parish in Bernardsville. She was married to Archibald Alexander, and had a son, Archibald Stevens. She remarried Henry Otto Wittpenn.

CLASS OF '73 RECIPIENT: Richard Axtell

CHARLES WILLIAM ENGELHARD SCIENCE AWARD: This award began in 1957. Charles William Engelhard Jr. sponsored the award. It was given in memory of his father, Charles William Engelhard, who founded Engelhard Minerals and Chemical Corporation in 1902. He passed away in 1950. He was 83 years old. Charles William Engelhard Jr. was born in Far Hills, New Jersey in 1917. He died in 1971 in Boca Grande, Florida. He was 54 years old. He attended the local Far Hills public schools and St. Paul's School in Concord, New Hampshire. He graduated from Princeton University. He was a precious metals magnate and chairman of Engelhard Minerals and Chemical Corporation. He was a major Democratic donor on the state and national levels and had been associated with presidents John F. Kennedy and Lyndon B. Johnson. A captain in the U.S. Army Air Corps, he was a bomber pilot during World War II. He purchased Cragwood, a 172-acre equestrian estate above Ravine Lake on the site of Somerset Hills' original 9-hole golf course. He also owned a stable of thoroughbred racehorses. He was commissioner of the Port of Authority of New York. He was a director of the Prudential Insurance Company of America, Public Service Electric and Gas, the Foreign Policy Association, the Newark Museum, the New Jersey State Chamber of Commerce, the New York Zoological Society, the Thomas Edison Council of the United States, and was trustee of Seton Hall University, the American Heritage Foundation, the Bernardsville Library and the John F. Kennedy Library. He also was president of the Somerset Hills Community Chest and vice president and trustee of the Museum of Immigration. He was married to Jane Annette Reiss Engelhard, and had daughters Annette, Mary Susan, Sophie, Sally, and Charlene.

CLASS OF '73 RECIPIENT: Dave Whitlock

HELEN WINIFRED GEHLE GRAYBARD ACADEMIC PROGRESS AWARD: This award began in 1972. Helen Winifred Gehle Graybard was born in Jersey City, New Jersey in 1920. Her husband, Mitchell Graybard, was the likely sponsor of this award. She died in 1972 in Morristown, New Jersey. She graduated from Hilton High School in Hilton, New York, and from Cornell University and Columbia University and served in the American Red Cross in France and Germany during World War II. She was a dietitian at L. Bamberger & Co. in Newark and was a director of food services for Byram Township Schools in New Jersey. She was an early leader and officer of Planned Parenthood and worked with the American Field Service and Family Counseling Service in Bernardsville. She was married to Jules Mitchell Graybard and had daughters Christina and Winifred.

HERBERT RIVINGTON PYNE SR. LANGUAGE AWARDS: This award began in 1970. Herbert Rivington Pyne, Jr. likely sponsored the award. It was given in honor of his father. Herbert Rivington Pyne, Sr. was born in New York City, New York in 1892. He died in 1952 in Bedminster, New Jersey. He graduated from Princeton University and received his doctoral degree from Columbia University. He was a chemist by training. He was secretary to the U.S. Ambassador to Germany and served as a pilot with the U.S. Army Air Force in France during World War I. He was active in Republican politics, starting as a member of the Bernardsville Borough Council and serving two terms as chairman of the Somerset County Republican Committee. Later, he became a member of the New Jersey General Assembly and the State Senate and was a delegate to the New Jersey Constitutional Convention. He was a member of the Bernardsville Borough Council and the Bernards Township Board of Education as well as a member of the Somerset County Welfare Board, a trustee of the Somerset Hospital, chairman of the Somerset Hills Red Cross chapter, and chairman of the Bedminster Salvage Committee during World War II. He also served as trustee of the American Museum of Natural History, the Orthopedic Hospital, and the St. Bernard's School in Peapack-Gladstone. He was married to Florence Ledyard Blair of the prominent Blair family in New Jersey and had sons Herbert Rivington Jr. and Insley Blair. John Insley Blair, Florence's 2nd great grandfather, one of the 19th century's wealthiest men. He helped to found Lafayette College (in Easton, Pennsylvania) in 1826, Grinnell College (in Grinnell, Iowa) in 1846, and Blair Academy (in Blairstown, NJ) in 1848. Her father, Dewitt Clinton Blair was a resident of Bedminster and built Blairsden overlooking Ravine Lake in 1903. He was also a founding member of Somerset Hills Golf Club.

EDWARD PALMER BUCHANAN SERVICE AWARD: This service award began in 1963. The Kiwanis Club of Bernardsville sponsored this award in honor of one of its members – Edward Palmer Buchanan. It was founded in 1948. Edward Palmer Buchanan was its 1st president. Edward Palmer Buchanan was born in Centralia, PA in 1904. He died in 1963 in Morristown, NJ. He graduated from the public schools in St. Clair, Pennsylvania. He attended the Staunton Military College in Virginia and graduated from Westchester Teachers College in PA and New York University. He was a math teacher and principal of Bernardsville Grammar School from 1931 to 1963. He was charter president of the Kiwanis Club, a former member of the Bernardsville Borough Council, and trustee and general chairman of the building fund of the First Presbyterian Church in Bernardsville. He had been a scoutmaster in Bernardsville, an assistant track coach at Bernards High School, and secretary-treasurer of the Somerset Hills Little League. He was an instructor in First Aid for the Somerset Hills Red Cross and member of Civil Defense Council during World War II. He was married to Alta Jacka Buchanan and had a son, Bruce John, and a daughter, Joan Ann.

Its founders wanted to form a society modeled after Phi Beta Kappa, the undergraduate collegiate honor society.

OTHER PRIVATE & PAROCHIAL SCHOOLS



BERNARDSVILLE, NJ

In 1916, thanks to the generosity of James Cox Brady, The School of St. Elizabeth opened its doors to K-8. Most of these students from this school went on to attend BHS for grades 9-12.



FAR HILLS, NJ

Founded in 1929, Far Hills Country Day School is K-8. While most of its students continue the education via private schools, only a handful of these students have gone on to attend BHS for grades 9-12.



PEAPACK-GLADSTONE, NJ

In 1972, St. Bernard's School for boys (7-12) in Gladstone (est. in 1900) and The Gill School for girls (K-12) in Bernardsville (est. 1934) merged to form Gill St. Bernard's School. In 1996, these 2 schools consolidated their operations in Gladstone for boys and girls (K-12). There is no known instance of a student from this school transferring to BHS for grades 9-12.



PEAPACK-GLADSTONE, NJ

After having purchased the George Mosle's estate in 1929, the Sisters of St. John the Baptist ran a convent. In 1949, they opened Mt. St. John Academy, a school for girls grades K-12. It closed in 1992. The property was purchased in 2006 by The Trust For Public Land of Morris County. There is no known instance of a student from this school transferring to BHS for grades 9-12.



PEAPACK-GLADSTONE, NJ

Founded in 1960, this school started as a K-3 elementary and grew to become a K-8 elementary school. With each passing year, the building was expanded and another class was added. In 1969, the kindergarten class of 1960 was the first class to graduate having been there K-8. Some of these students went on to BHS 9-12. In 1970, the school ceased operating as a parochial school and continued to run as a private school. It closed in 1973.



PEAPACK-GLADSTONE, NJ

Founded in 2000, The Willow School is K-8. While most of its students continue their education via private schools, a few have gone on to attend BHS for 9-12. There is no known instance of a student from this school transferring to BHS for grades 9-12.
